## Our Youngest Generations are Missing Millions

As American families continue to fracture, our youngest generations are suffering the consequences. You have probably heard of Generation Z, the so-called "Zoomers" born between 1999-2009. But did you know that they have now been joined by a younger generation? Generation Alpha, as it is called, is composed of children born from 2010-2024. These are the "iPad kids", who have been constantly exposed to technology since infancy.

Many of these two younger generations have spent far more time online than they have with their own parents, especially if their parents are both working or have divorced. African villagers used to say that "It takes a village" to raise a child. But in America not only have the "villages" disappeared, but extended families are becoming less common as well, and even nuclear families—consisting of a father and a mother and their

natural or adopted children—are in the minority.

Children have inherent social needs that must be met in order for them to properly develop and thrive in this world. Even the smallest support can make a big difference; sometimes one person, just one conversation can make all the difference in moments of stress, confusion, and depression.

So what happens when the only "conversation" you can have is with your iPad's AI, because your only parent is at work, and the brother or sister you should have had was aborted before you were born?

So how many Gen Z and Gen Alpha kids have been lost to abortion?

Exact numbers are hard to come by. But we can cross-reference abortion data from the Guttmacher Institute, CDC, and Kaiser Family Foundation to get a pretty good idea of the total number of abortions each year from 1999 on. Since we know how many babies were born each year, we can calculate the abortion rate—the percentage of Gen Z and Gen Alpha who didn't make it out of the womb alive.

## DKT International: The Global Network for Abortion Pills

In recent months, the Population Research Institute (PRI) has documented, with significant amounts of evidence, the activities of three major abortion networks: FIGO, CLACAI, and FP2030. Each of these has played a specific role in the international expansion of abortion.

Now, we have turned our attention to another key player: DKT International.

Founded in 1989, this organization presents itself as a promoter of "sexual and reproductive health," but in reality, it has become the world's **largest distributor of abortion pills**, using sophisticated social marketing networks specifically designed to evade pharmaceutical regulations.

On September 2, 2025, DKT announced that it would double its commitment to Family Planning 2030 (FP2030), pledging a total of \$2 billion by 2030.

This announcement not only revealed DKT's financial power, but also its intent to fill the void left by the Trump Administration, which, under the Mexico City Policy, prohibited the use of U.S. federal funds to finance or-

ganizations that promote or perform abortions.

DKT's press release hinted at a carefully crafted strategy:

- Shielding the FP2030 network to ensure abortion remains an essential component disguised as "family planning."
- Replacing traditional donors, from government agencies to private foundations, that have reduced their political exposure in this area.
- Expanding aggressively into emerging markets, particularly in Africa and Latin America, where cultural and legal resistance to abortion remains strong.

In short, this \$2 billion pledge is not philanthropy, it is an investment to sustain and scale abortion by pills on a global level.

## A "Glocal" Network: Global Thinking, Local Execution

What makes DKT unique is its operational model.

Unlike traditional pharmaceutical companies, DKT combines multina-

tional logistics with localized social marketing.

This means youth-focused campaigns, parallel distribution networks, and covert sales of dangerous abortifacients, such as misoprostol and mifepristone.

Under deceptive labels like "safe options" or "reproductive rights," DKT promotes self-managed home abortions, even in countries where abortion is illegal.

The consequences are severe:

- Erosion of national sovereignty: National health frameworks become subordinate to foreign agendas.
- Normalization of illegality: The line between clinical and clandestine abortion blurs.
- Overburdened healthcare systems: Local hospitals are forced to treat post-abortion complications without additional resources.
- Manipulation of public opinion: The language of "reproductive health" weakens cultural resistance to abortion.

## The Peru Case: A Look Inside the Machinery

Peru provides a concrete example.

There, DKT operates as DKT Perú S.A.C., registered as a pharmaceutical company in Lima with authorization from the General Directorate of Medicines, Supplies, and Drugs (DIGEMID), Peru's equivalent of the U.S. FDA.

Under this license, it imports misoprostol from India, manufactured by Naari Pharma, a strategic partner that has also obtained health registrations for misoprostol in Colombia and Ecuador.

Although abortion in Peru is illegal except when the mother's life is at risk, investigations show that these products often end up in clandestine networks, facilitating self-managed abortions.

The strategy is the same everywhere: register the products, import them legally, and then promote them as part of a "rights package," regardless of national law.

Yet Peru also stands as a symbol of pro-life resistance.

Through the Ibero-America Office of the Population Research Institute, support is being given to the Padres Peruanos (Peruvian Parents) citizen platform, which is running a signature campaign demanding that DIGEMID conduct a thorough audit of DKT Perú's imports and sales.

Peruvians understand the urgency of stopping the spread of abortion pills and defending the life and health of women and their unborn children.

#### A Direct Challenge to the Trump Administration's Funding Restrictions

DKT International is no minor actor, it is the global giant of chemical abortion.

With operations in more than 100 countries, strategic alliances in



India, and a narrative that presents abortion as a supposed "right," this network seeks to impose a model in which the cultural and legal objections of nations are subordinated to the abortion industry.

Far from being deterred by U.S. funding restrictions, DKT has chosen to circumvent them through private commitments and a dense international financing network.

Its decision to invest \$2 billion in FP2030 is a direct and defiant message: the abortion machinery has no intention of stopping.

Our response must be even stronger and more resolute.

It is essential to support the Trump Administration, which not only reinstated the Mexico City Policy but expanded it, ensuring that American taxpayers' money will not, directly or indirectly, fund organizations that promote or perform abortions.

It is our duty to expose and resist this agenda, and to defend, with conviction, that the resources of U.S. citizens must never sustain a network seeking to expand abortion under the guise of "reproductive health."

Bear in mind that, while all three of these organizations are pro-abortion, they vary in the way they compile their numbers. Guttmacher reports data from all 50 states and will even sometimes produce estimates if data is missing. The CDC, on the other hand, only passively compiles the numbers that have been reported to it. Its data is incomplete, not only because it does not include all 50 states, but because many abortions go unreported.

The numbers show that Gen Z lost over 16 million over its members to abortion, while Gen Alpha lost upwards of 12 million. Adding these numbers to the total number of births will give us an approximation of how many babies were conceived, from which we can calculate the percentage who were aborted. (This calculation does not include miscarriages.)

Our calculations show that roughly 21 percent of Gen Z was aborted, and 18 percent of Gen Alpha was aborted. In other words, each generation is missing close to twenty percent of its members.

Other estimates run even higher, with some demographers concluding that over 25 percent of the last two generations have been sacrificed to abortion.<sup>1</sup>

The loss to both society and to their siblings is incalculable. Think of the doctors, musicians, researchers, foster guardians, artists, and inventors who are not with us. Think of the sons and daughters, brothers and sisters, and husbands and wives who are missing from our families. Think of the millions of bodies ripped apart, and the fabric of our communities shredded, all in the name of bodily autonomy.<sup>2</sup>

It is no coincidence that Gen Z and Gen Alpha are suffering from the highest levels of stress, depression, and isolation ever recorded. Members of Gen Z, especially, often report feeling unable to take on adult roles, or shoulder the burden of a family. Tragically, this seems to be generating even higher levels of abortion.

How high?

According to a study by the Office for National Statistics, by 2022, half of all pregnancies of Gen Z members end in abortion.

It was bad enough that a quarter of all Gen Z'ers were lost to abortion, but it is sad beyond belief that the survivors are now choosing themselves to abort half of their children.

I say "choosing," but in many cases the young women in question have been denied an informed choice. Often without the support of a loving family, often under pressure from school counselors or boyfriends, often without any financial means, they have been told that they have no choice but to have an abortion. Coercion by any other name is still coercion.

If Gen Alpha follows the same path as Gen Z, then America's birth rate will continue to fall. The current U.S. fertility rate of only 1.6 births per woman—already much lower than the 2.1 needed for replacement—will soon be in the rearview mirror as rates plummet even further.

Unless this changes, the isolation experienced by the last two generations will only get worse. In a world of only-child homes, divorced parents, and no community involvement, how could it not? Human beings need parents, siblings, cousins, neighbors, schoolmates, work friends, sports teams, and the like to thrive. We are meant to live in community with one another, not to be isolated in front of unfeeling computer monitors.

How can we, as Christians, and America as a country, turn this around?

The first step is to stop the killing. Abortion was once regarded as unthinkable. It must be so thought of again. This means, among other things, taking the abortion pill off the market.

Second, we must make birth free. There is no reason why the wealthiest country in the world should be unable to bear the cost of childbearing for young couples willing to have children. Especially because, down the road, our country will reap huge benefits from the higher birth rate that will result.

Third, couples willing to bear and raise children should be sheltered from all taxes, including social security. After all, in having children they are providing for the future of America in the most fundamental way, by providing future generations.

The future belongs to the fruitful.



## Can Anything Good Come Out of Europe?

We have become accustomed to bad news from Europe. Abortion, progressive ideologies, and attacks on the family seem to be getting ever worse.

But now, at last, the tide may be turning.

France's Emmanuel Macron has been obsessed with making abortion a human right in the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, after having already incorporated it into France's own Constitution. But in recent weeks the Netherlands—of all countries—has unexpectedly slammed the door on his initiative, which requires unanimity among all EU member states.

#### The Netherlands Stops Macron's "Abortion Right"

The Netherlands is a "progressive" country that has adopted a host of very dark policies, such such as euthanasia and selective abortion after prenatal diagnosis.

But when a motion was presented to the Dutch Parliament on September 29 asking the government to cooperate with an effort to include a right to abortion both in the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights and in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the Dutch unexpectedly said no.

The motion was supported by the usual leftist parties: D66 (Democrats 66), SP (Socialists), VVD (Liberals), and GroenLinks-Pv-dA (Green-Social Democrats). But they were only able to cobble together 68 votes, short of the 76 needed for a majority of the 150 seats in the Chamber.

Not only did the majority reject the proposal to make abortion a "human right," they went on the offensive. The Reformed Political Party (SGP), together with the Christian Union (CU) and Forum for Democracy (FvD), prepared a counter-motion. The motion calls on the Prime Minister to to *actively oppose* any attempt to enshrine abortion as a human right in European treaties.

This counter-motion is still pending a vote but, in any event,

the door has been slammed in the face of those who wish to impose a false and unjust so-called "right" to abortion.

This does not mean that the Netherlands has become pro-life. During the same session, another motion, presented by SP, D66, and GroenLinks-PvdA, was approved, asking the government to include care for victims of sexual violence as a standard part of basic emergency services, incorporating among other measures so-called "abortion care." Only the PVV, SGP, and CU parties voted against it; FvD was absent.

Two other motions, one to make reducing the number of abortions an explicit goal of Dutch foreign policy, and another to review the legal abortion period, were rejected by the Chamber. In short, the pro-life struggle continues, as those at the Dutch Center for Bioethical Reform (DCBR), the most active pro-life group in that parliament, well know.

## Madrid Addresses Post-Abortion Syndrome

From Madrid, Spain, also comes good news. The VOX councilwoman in the Madrid City Coun-

cil, Carla Toscano, succeeded in having city authorities require the dissemination of information about *Post-Abortion Syndrome*. Specifically, the approved text reads:

"That the city government team of the Madrid City Council, through the various relevant departments, shall provide information, mandatory, verbal and written, permanent and visible, about Post-Abortion Syndrome in the public service centers of Madrid Salud, Equality Spaces, Samur Social (emergency medical services), and social workers of the Madrid City Council, and that such information be included on the official websites of these agencies, and on posters and brochures in the mentioned areas."

This is a fundamental step toward raising public awareness about the threat abortion poses to a woman's mental health. The local progressive press has portrayed it as an unacceptable form of punishment for women, of course, but in fact, as the authors of the measure, the NGO *ActúaFamilia*, explain, it is simply a matter of informed consent.

Is the political left against transparency and freedom? Of course it is. The Ministry of Health has already launched a counterattack. Abortion promoters fear for their business, and do not want the downsides of their deadly procedure to be mentioned. And this comes despite the fact that, amidst a devastating demographic winter, Spain has already recorded 105,000 abortion deaths.

In any case, this is a positive first step by Spain's capital city, and one that other cities may follow.

#### Slovakia Shields Itself Against Woke Ideology

But the good news doesn't stop there. Slovakia has just approved a constitutional reform to protect itself against ideological colonization by Brussels. The reform rejects gender ideology, the imposition of abortion, and any other progressive policy coming from the European Union. It was passed by the required three-fifths majority in Parliament. From now on, Brussels will have a much harder time imposing "woke" ideology on this full EU member state, as doing so would violate Slovakia's Constitution.

Slovakia has limited the EU's encroachments by passing a constitutional amendment establishing the primacy of national law over EU law in matters of cultural identity, ethics, health, and education. The new amendment basically tells the EU, "Respect the autonomy of the Slovakian people, and stop with your absurd Leftist ideological impositions."

EU bureaucrats have criticized the measure, of course, claiming that it restricts LGTBIQ+ rights and the autonomy of NGOs. That's a gross exaggeration. The measure simply ensures that Slovak laws will take precedence over EU regulations in specific areas such as cultural identity, ethics, health, and education.

For example:

- Sexual education in schools can only be taught with explicit consent from a legal guardian.
- Gender is understood in binary terms: only male and female.
- Surrogacy is prohibited.
- Adoption is restricted to married heterosexual couples.

Regarding NGOs, the new law requires them to disclose their directors and donors, a basic condition of transparency and accountability. Why would this be a problem? Because the EU and foreign progressive donors want to set up front groups in Slovakia to lobby for leftist policies.

This reform was promoted by Prime Minister Robert Fico's government, which described it as a response to the "progressive impositions" of the EU. "Slovakia is not for sale, and our traditions will not be diluted," said the Prime Minister, appealing to "natural values."

Natural values sound a lot like the natural law, which, of course, comes from God.

Slovakia is thus another obstacle to Macron's plans to impose a false "human right" to abortion.

#### Conclusion

As we can see, Europe faces many challenges, but there are also reasons for hope, and for continuing the fight for a better society.

We in PRI's European office will continue to fight on.

### From the Countries



A new study in the Journal of Psychiatric Research confirms what pro-lifers have long warned: abortion devastates women's mental health. Tracking over 1.2 million pregnancies in Quebec, researchers found women who aborted were more than twice as likely to be hospitalized for psychiatric disorders, substance abuse, or suicide attempts compared to women who gave birth. For every 10,000 women tracked over time, about 104 who had abortions ended up hospitalized for mental health issues, compared to just 42 who gave birth. The risk was highest in the first five years and increased with repeat abortions. Adding to mounting U.S. data, this study underscores that abortion not childbirth-leaves deep and lasting scars on women's bodies, minds, and souls.1



For the first time in 80 years, France recorded more deaths than births in 2024—651,000 deaths versus 650,000 births—marking a historic demographic turning point. Declining fertility since 2010 and rising deaths as baby boomers age have

pushed the nation into natural population decline. Unlike Germany and Spain, which offset losses more through immigration, France has no clear strategy. With fertility falling across Europe and immigration debates intensifying, France faces a future of economic strain, cultural uncertainty, and a population now shrinking from within.<sup>2</sup>



#### GREECE Falling Fertility Leaves Classrooms Empty

Greece has shuttered 766 schools over 5% of the nation's total—after plunging fertility has left classrooms empty. Primary schools took the hardest hit, with closures rising from 247 in 2018-2019 to 324 this year, while kindergartens jumped from 312 to 358. In just seven years, the number of primary students has fallen by 111,000, a 19% drop. Greece's fertility rate has collapsed to 1.35, among the lowest in Europe. Despite cash bonuses for newborns, deaths nearly doubled births in 2023. Officials warn that the crisis threatens the survival of Greece's society and economy.3



South Korea's Catholic bishops are sounding the alarm over a proposed

amendment to the nation's abortion law that would legalize abortion on demand and even cover it under national health insurance. The Catholic Bishops' Conference of Korea (CBCK) blasted the bill, introduced by Democratic Party lawmaker Nam In-soon, for softening language from "artificial intervention for abortion" to "artificial termination of pregnancy," warning it trivializes the killing of unborn children. The bishops warned that the measure violates the Constitution's protection of human dignity and life, risks women's health, and would only fuel higher abortion rates.4



Taiwan, now a "super-aged society" with over 20% of its people over 65, is scrambling to reverse one of the world's lowest birth rates. The government approved new subsidies of \$3,320 per newborn (nearly \$7,000 for twins), replacing smaller payouts. Regionally, Hong Kong offers \$2,500 per baby, and South Korea \$2,200 after two children. Over 120,000 families may benefit. Yet with fertility at just 0.87 births per woman in 2022, experts warn that subsidies alone cannot save Taiwan from demographic collapse.<sup>5</sup>

### PRI President Speaks at Focus on Life Dinner

PRI President Steven Mosher was the keynote speaker at the Focus on Life Dinner in Michigan, hosted by the Downriver affiliates of Right to Life of Michigan. Drawing from his firsthand experience in China during the brutal One-Child Policy, Mosher exposed how mothers—even nine months pregnant—were forced into abortions.
