Executive Summary

Family Planning 2030 (FP2030) presents itself before the international community as a technical, inclusive and neutral platform, dedicated to guaranteeing access to modern methods of family planning with an approach based on human rights. Its institutional discourse appeals to the so-called need to empower women and girls through access to contraceptives and sexual and reproductive health services, and it states that it promotes equity, autonomy and sustainable development. However, this report demonstrates, based on official documentation, institutional statements and public records, that FP2030 has discreetly integrated abortion as an essential and non negotiable component of its model of family planning. This incorporation is not carried out openly or explicitly in its general presentation, and it obeys 3 fundamental strategic reasons:

1. In numerous countries abortion continues to be illegal, partially or totally, which prevents the organizations that promote it from acting openly without incurring legal consequences or loss of legitimacy before local governments.
2. The current international consensus, especially in forums such as the United Nations, has expressly excluded abortion as a method of family planning. Therefore, its inclusion within this scope must be done by means of euphemisms, ambiguous terms or appeals to concepts such as “sexual and reproductive rights.”
3. The Mexico City Policy, driven by Republican governments of the United States (including the Trump Administration in 2017 and 2025), prohibits assigning federal funds to organizations that promote or practice abortions outside the country. FP2030, which receives financing from USAID, avoids openly declaring its role in the expansion of abortion so as not to compromise its international financial flow.

In Chapter 1, this FP2030 report examines the institutional architecture of FP2030. It describes its evolution from FP2020 and its consolidation as an international network that articulates governments, NGOs, private foundations and multilateral bodies. Through 5 regional hubs — with presence in Africa, Asia, Europe, Ibero America and the Caribbean — FP2030 coordinates actions, monitors national commitments and adapts its strategy to local contexts. Although it presents itself as a network of family planning centered on access to modern contraceptives, its own documents show that FP2030 considers abortion part of the “comprehensive reproductive health package,” functionally equating it with contraception. This approach is concealed under expressions such as “informed decisions,” “comprehensive services,” or “access to reproductive rights.”

In Chapter 2, the report demonstrates that FP2030 is not only ideologically committed to the promotion of abortion, but that it does so with financial support from governmental agencies such as USAID, the principal bilateral donor for family planning in the world.



In 2022, USAID granted a \$15,000,000 subsidy to FP2030. Although the official releases state that the funds are destined for voluntary family planning, the documentation reveals that these resources are used to sustain institutional structures — such as the regional hubs — that promote abortion indirectly or covertly.

FP2030 has recently removed the record of USAID as a donor from its website, although its financial linkage is verifiable through digital archiving tools such as the Wayback Machine. The alliance also channels funds to programs in countries such as Ethiopia, Kenya, the Philippines and Zambia, in which partner organizations offer abortion services or advocate for its legalization.

Chapter 3 presents the core of the report: FP2030 considers abortion a fundamental service of sexual and reproductive health. In section 3.1, multiple institutional statements are collected, such as the one disseminated on March 17, 2025, in which leaders of member organizations declare that “contraception and safe abortion must be available within public health systems.” Through its social networks, FP2030 promotes courses and campaigns organized by feminist pro abortion networks, such as the “National Campaign for the Right to Legal, Safe and Free Abortion” in Argentina. It also publishes articles that present abortion as a “human right” and consider it a legitimate solution in the face of poverty or lack of resources.

Section 3.2 of the report explains that this stance is not only sanitary or technical, but deeply political. FP2030 has adopted a position of active confrontation toward the Mexico City Policy, applied during the terms of Donald Trump, which prohibits foreign NGOs that receive U.S. funds from promoting or performing abortions. Instead of excluding abortion as a method of family planning, FP2030 responded by labeling these restrictions as “a hard blow for women’s health” and went out in search of new financing aligned with its pro abortion agenda.

In Chapter 4, it is shown how the organizations that integrate FP2030 promote and perform abortions without ambiguities. This chapter documents how its most influential international partners — among them IPPF, MSI Reproductive Choices, Pathfinder International, Women Deliver, EngenderHealth, Fòs Feminista, FIGO and the Guttmacher Institute — openly promote abortion as a human right, demand its decriminalization, and include it as an essential service in their clinics, campaigns, and educational platforms.

These organizations develop legal, communications, and clinical strategies to institutionalize abortion as public policy. Some promote self managed abortion, telemedicine abortion, and the incorporation of abortion into Comprehensive Sexual Education (CSE).

At the regional level, the member NGOs in Ibero America — such as MEXFAM (Mexico), Profamilia (Colombia), APROFA (Chile), PROMSEX and Manuela Ramos (Peru), CIES (Bolivia), the Oriéntame Foundation and ASISTE (Colombia) — reproduce the same guidelines: provision of abortion services, normalization campaigns, production of educational materials and strategic litigation. All this under the framework of FP2030, which acts as an articulating platform.



In summary, the research contained in this report demonstrates that FP2030 has adopted abortion as an essential component of its notion of family planning, although it hides it behind technical and rights based language.

This strategy responds to legal limitations, political constraints, and financing barriers that impede an open presentation of abortion as an institutional objective. However, when analyzing its structure, its allies and its real activity, it is clear that FP2030 is today a global platform of coordinated influence for the legalization, legitimation and normalization of abortion, which articulates financial resources, political influence and technical capacity to modify the paradigm of sexual and reproductive health at a global level.



1. The structure of the Family Planning 2030 abortionist network

FP2030 has as its immediate antecedent the Family Planning 2020 (FP2020) initiative. According to its website, this network was created in 2012 under the slogan: “all women and girls, wherever they live, must have access to modern contraceptive methods.”

Its official launch took place in May 2013, during the London Summit organized by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation together with the United Kingdom’s Department for International Development. In that framework, the objective was set to provide access to modern contraceptives to 120 million women and girls.



From its beginnings, FP2020 set out to articulate “new alliances among countries, manufacturers, the research community, and civil society,” with the aim of generating “a new commitment and momentum for family planning efforts around the world.”

Between 2012 and 2020, it managed to bring together 136 institutional actors, including governments, private foundations, multilateral organizations, civil society organizations, and entities from the private sector.

At the end of 2020 a new stage of the initiative was presented, now under the name of FP2030, with the purpose of extending and strengthening the global commitments in family planning toward the year 2030.

According to an [article](#) published in **PubMed Central** on September 9, 2021, the strategic objectives of FP2030 were defined on the basis of the recommendations of 23 key informants coming from governments, civil society organizations, and youth networks, as well as implementing partners and bilateral and multilateral entities from Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Europe and North America. The same article laments that there were few government representatives among the informants surveyed.

The central axis of these recommendations was the so called “rights based approach,” considered by the participants as the most effective way of achieving the sustained commitment of States, despite the challenges that this would imply. The following chapters of this report will analyze how within this “rights approach” the “right to abortion” is expressly included.

Organizational Structure of FP2030

From its main headquarters in Washington, D.C., United States, FP2030 coordinates a global network that maintains links with more than 85 countries.

FP2030 operates as a decentralized global platform, structured in **5 regions or hubs**, through which it articulates its international network. This network is composed of **3 principal categories of members**: governments, nongovernmental organizations, and donors. Together, they make up the initiative’s **global support network**.

Each regional center has a local technical and management team, trained to adapt the global strategy to the specific context of each country. Among its functions are the building of national alliances, the follow up of the commitments undertaken, and the guarantee that these are measurable, sustainable, and suitable to local realities.

The central executive team works in coordination with 5 regional offices; each headquartered at a strategic point:



Eastern and Southern Africa:

In Eastern and Southern Africa, the work is articulated through a regional center headquartered in Nairobi, hosted by AMREF Health Africa. The direction of the Regional Center for this region is in the charge of [Dr. Sheila Nyawira Macharia](#).

The [program](#) in Eastern and Southern Africa focuses on “the expansion of high impact practices, the work with adolescents and youth, the mobilization of internal resources, preparedness and response to emergencies, as well as transversal advocacy, the use of data, the establishment of alliances, and shared learning.”

Among the news of the region, FP2030 disseminated a report about [Ethiopia](#), highlighting that after the liberalization of the abortion law in 2005, the government implemented programs to train health professionals, equip medical centers, expand services, and integrate abortion care into reproductive health. These initiatives produced significant advances in access to abortion and furthermore the proportion of abortions performed in health facilities almost doubled between 2008 and 2014. The findings come from articles prepared by the Guttmacher Institute and Ipas, in collaboration with the Ethiopian Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the Ethiopian Public Health Association.

North, Western, and Central Africa

In North, Western, and Central Africa, the work is organized through a regional center headquartered in Abuja, hosted by Population Council in Nigeria. The financial and administrative coordination of the Regional Center for this region is in the charge of [Chidinma Ajaero](#).

The program in this region centers on “sustainable and predictable financing of family planning, the expansion of high impact practices that include immediate postpartum family planning, the participation and leadership of youth, and the integration of family planning into primary health care.”

Among the news of the region, FP2030 disseminated an [official update from Ipas](#) in which it is affirmed that “the programs supported by Ipas, in collaboration with the national, regional and state health systems of 17 countries, train clinical professionals in safe abortion care.”

Asia and the Pacific

In Asia and the Pacific, the work is articulated through a regional center headquartered in Malaysia, organized by the office of the International Planned Parenthood Federation, Region of East and Southeast Asia and Oceania (IPPF ESEAOR). The direction of the Regional Center for Asia and the Pacific is in the charge of [Sumita Banjaree](#).

The [program](#) in this region seeks to strengthen the accountability of countries in commitments of family planning, provide technical assistance and high impact practices, forge strategic alliances, promote efforts of policy advocacy, and facilitate the exchange of knowledge by means of workshops, webinars, and discussion groups.



Among the news of the region, FP2030 shared the publication “[MIRA – How Donald Trump’s anti abortion policy affects Nepal](#)” from BBC–Nepal in which it is noted that, on his first day as President of the United States, Donald Trump signed a prohibition that prevents U.S. government money from going to international groups that perform or provide information about abortions. According to the report, many international charities expressed concern that this order would affect women’s health care, particularly in poor and developing countries.

Latin America and the Caribbean

In Latin America and the Caribbean, the work is organized through a regional center headquartered in Panama City, Panama, co hosted by Save the Children and Profamilia Colombia. The direction of the Regional Center for this region is in the charge of [María Paula Martínez](#).

The [program](#) in Latin America and the Caribbean seeks “to establish a solid and diverse team by actively hiring personnel for the FP2030 LAC center in Panama City; to interact with the family planning movement in the region to understand and assess the specific needs of each country; and to identify priority areas of action and intervention based on these assessments, with special attention to the key challenges and gaps in family planning services and programs.”

North American and Europe

In North America and Europe, the work is organized through a regional center headquarters in Washington, D.C., hosted by the United Nations Foundation. The direction of the Regional Center for this region is in the charge of [Monica Kerrigan](#).

The [program](#) in North America and Europe centers on the development of data and measurements of family planning, the implementation of gender transformative approaches, the promotion and establishment of global partnerships, the application of high impact practices (HIP), and the active participation of the private sector.

Data on FP2030 members

According to the information gathered on FP2030’s website:

- 39 governments form part of the network as state commitment makers, committing themselves to promoting policies that guarantee access to sexual and reproductive health services. It is striking that FP2020 had 48 committed governments and FP2030 has 9 fewer countries.

- 104 nongovernmental organizations (including youth, academic, multilateral and private sector organizations) have adhered as commitment makers, collaborating in the elimination of barriers to access to modern contraceptives. This number represents a significant increase in comparison with FP2020, which counted only 63 associated NGOs.

- 5 committed donors, including governments, foundations and multilateral institutions, financially support the global agenda of family planning in accordance with their foreign policy and international development strategies. It is noteworthy that the number of donors has decreased significantly in comparison with the previous stage of the initiative: FP2020 had 25 institutional donors.

This institutional architecture allows FP2030 to expand its influence at the regional and global levels, positioning itself as a key actor in the articulation of family planning policies.



2. Evidence of USAID financing to FP2030

The very documentation published by FP2030 shows that USAID was one of the principal financial supports of this international network, which integrates abortion as a central component of its global family planning strategy. Official records indicate contributions destined both to the strengthening of the alliance as a whole — including multi year financing to sustain the structure of regional hubs — and to specific projects in countries, from the Philippines to Ethiopia.

Although the evidence presented below does not constitute an exhaustive inventory, it allows the decisive backing of USAID to FP2030's fundamental strategy to be verified, guaranteeing its institutional operability and the continuity of its programs in different regions of the world.

2022: USAID announced a grant of \$15,000,000 to FP2030

On November 16, 2022, FP2030 published a communiqué from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in which the awarding of a grant of \$15,000,000, to be executed in a period of 5 years, was announced, with the purpose of strengthening the operations of the FP2030 global alliance. According to what is stated in the document, these resources — granted in function of budget availability — would be destined to consolidate the global leadership of the platform and to provide technical assistance in family planning, with the objective of expanding access to contraceptive methods for millions of women and girls throughout the world, especially in the countries considered priorities by USAID.

The communiqué also highlighted that USAID would play a central role in this initiative, not only for its financial weight but also as a “key technical partner,” recalling that it was a founding member of the predecessor platform, Family Planning 2020. Likewise, it was emphasized that the investment would reinforce the model of “locally led development” by means of partnerships with community networks and grassroots organizations, while at the same time financing the FP2030 Support Network, composed of regional centers in Africa, Asia, Ibero America and the United States.

Despite the emphasis placed on the funds being oriented to programs of “voluntary family planning” and to guaranteeing what they call “women’s free decisions,” as will be demonstrated in the following sections of this report, behind this language abortion is incorporated as an essential component of the services promoted by the alliance. In practice, these funds end up financing initiatives that normalize and facilitate the termination of pregnancy, presenting it as an integral part of “reproductive health” and granting it institutional legitimacy under the FP2030 umbrella.



USAID has been a donor member of the FP2030 Support Network. The FP2030 website recorded USAID as one of its donor members. Although currently that content has been removed, it can be recovered through the tool The Wayback Machine, as is shown in the illustration included later.

FP2030 highlights that, in addition to contributing \$15,000,000 to finance the alliance, USAID provided “global leadership and cutting edge family planning technical assistance.” Among the fifteen commitments assumed by USAID within the framework of FP2030 is “advocating for policy changes and supporting legal frameworks that protect and promote reproductive rights and access to family planning.” As developed in Chapters 3 and 4 of this report, those “rights” and “access” explicitly include the dimension of abortion.

USAID stop work order evidences financing to FP2030 in 7 African countries

In a communiqué published in 2025 in the Blogs and Articles section of the FP2030 website, it is noted that the organization’s activities in Ethiopia, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Malawi will be affected by the suspension of USAID financing following the new policies announced by the Donald Trump administration in January of that same year.

These 7 countries form part of the Eastern and Southern Africa hub of FP2030, whose representatives were convened during the first semester of 2025 with the aim of “understanding the magnitude and the nature” of the USAID cut in funds and exploring alternative financing that would allow the alliance to continue providing “technical assistance.”

USAID financing to countries channeled through FP2030

Philippines

FP2030 shares the Concept Document of the “USAID/Philippines Health Project 2017–2021” in the “Resources” section of its website. It establishes guidelines to authorize and award new health activities starting in 2018 and proposes changes to focus on USAID’s family-planning programs incorporating the gender-equality approach.

Ethiopia

In January 2017, FP2030 reported in the “News” section of its website that USAID, in collaboration with Pathfinder and John Snow, Inc., executed the Integrated Family Health Program in Ethiopia.

The program, begun in July 2008, was implemented in 300 woredas (districts) in various regions of the country, with an approximate budget of \$110,000,000 and a reach of 37.8 million people. Its main axis was family planning, achieving a significant increase in contraceptive use among women, from 27% to 56%. In addition, it included the training of providers in the public sector and in civil-society organizations, as well as the mobilization of internal resources in health centers to strengthen family-planning services.

3. Evidence of promotion of abortion by FP2030

Having examined the structure of FP2030 and the network of organizations and governments that back it, as well as the strategic financing received from agencies such as USAID, this chapter constitutes the core of the report. Here we will show, with clear evidence, how FP2030 is not simply an alliance for family planning, but a global platform that integrates abortion as an essential, non-negotiable, and systematically promoted component within sexual and reproductive health services.

In section 3.1, FP2030's own statements and those of its most visible members will be presented, where it is openly affirmed that abortion is a "fundamental health service" on the same level as contraceptives. This stance is supported by institutional discourses, publications on its social networks, articles on its website, and participation in events promoted by openly pro-abortion groups.

Section 3.2 will show how this ideological conception translates into concrete political consequences. FP2030 not only promotes abortion but responds aggressively to any attempt to limit its financing or its global expansion, as occurred with the policies implemented during the presidency of Donald Trump. The reason is clear: If abortion were not an essential part of its family-planning strategy, such restrictions would have no impact whatsoever.

However, since it is a component that they cannot — or do not want to — dispense with, the network is directly affected. In this section, both official statements and the articles and communiqués that reflect its position regarding the Mexico City Policy, renamed the "Global Gag Rule" by abortion promoters — among them FP2030's own members — will be analyzed. Far from adjusting its guidelines, the network labeled these limitations a "hard blow to women's health" and turned to the search for new funding from actors aligned with its pro-abortion agenda.

This chapter makes clear that FP2030 is not a neutral or technical actor: it is a platform of political and ideological pressure whose mission is to normalize abortion as a universal right.

3.1. FP2030 considers abortion to be a fundamental health service

The statement published on its official website on March 17, 2025 contains several assertions that clearly reflect the inclusion of abortion as an integral part of the sexual and reproductive health agenda promoted by FP2030.

The first assertion is a quote from Ulla E. Muller, president and chief executive officer of EngenderHealth, one of the organizations committed to the alliance. Muller states: "Contraception, safe abortion, and the ability of women and children to decide how many children to have unlock their potential and guarantee their empowerment." She also adds that both services must be available within public health systems.



On its official X account, FP2030’s Latin America and the Caribbean hub reproduced a November 2, 2024 post about a course organized by the “National Campaign for the Right to Legal, Safe, and Free Abortion” of Argentina, together with the RUDA University Network. This activity promotes the enforceability of abortion as a “right,” from a feminist perspective. And, as shown in the post, the opening presentation was given by FP2030.

FP2030 published on its website the article from Monitor magazine that tells the story of Asyiah Nagudi, a 25-year-old young woman who, in her view, was denied her “right” to abort. It is worth highlighting that the case of this young woman was simply that she was poor and did not have the resources to “feed her children twice a day.” The title of the article makes it clear that the organization considers abortion a human right.

3.2. FP2030 criticizes the Trump government for cutting funds to organizations that promote abortion

FP2030 spoke out openly against the cuts applied in the two terms Donald Trump’s U.S. presidency to international aid destined for organizations that promote or perform abortions. These restrictions correspond to the so-called Mexico City Policy, established for the first time by President Ronald Reagan on January 20, 1985, during the United Nations International Conference on Population and Development held in that city. Since its creation, this policy has been systematically reinstated by Republican governments and repealed by Democratic administrations.

During his terms, Donald Trump has not only reinstated this policy in 2017 and again in 2025, but significantly expanded its scope, extending it to all health programs financed with U.S. funds, including those linked to HIV/AIDS, maternal and child health, and other related areas. Both FP2030 and other opponents of this policy have renamed it the “Global Gag Rule,” arguing that the exclusion of abortion in publicly funded programs represents, from their perspective, a restriction on the exercise of the “right to abortion.” This designation reflects an ideological stance that conceives abortion as an essential and inseparable component of sexual and reproductive health services.

It should be noted, however, that the Mexico City Policy does not impede the financing of family-planning programs that do not include abortion, but rather establishes as a condition that U.S. public funds not be destined directly or indirectly to activities related to its promotion or provision.



Faced with the dilemma of moving forward with family-planning programs that exclude the promotion or performance of abortions, FP2030 opted to confront the Trump government openly. **Therefore, FP2030’s public opposition to these provisions evidences its commitment to the inclusion of abortion in its programs and its positioning within the global debate over what is understood as “family planning.”**

3.2.1. Statements by FP2030 Members against Trump policy

On March 17, 2025, FP2030 disseminated on its website the statements of Ulla E. Muller, president and chief executive officer of EngenderHealth. In her intervention, Muller questioned the Mexico City Policy for restricting the access of international organizations to cooperation from the government of the United States.

FP2030 qualified Trump’s policy as “a hard blow to women’s health.” It refers to the Mexico City Policy as the “Global Gag Rule.” Using Kenya as an example, it affirmed that the consequence of Trump’s measure will be that the principal providers of family-planning services will have to close completely.

Esto significa que las vidas de algunas de las mujeres y niñas más vulnerables correrán un grave peligro.

3.2.2. FP2030 reproduces criticism of Trump policy

In coherence with its link with organizations that promote or perform abortions as part of family-planning programs, FP2030 has disseminated on its website content critical of the foreign policy of the Trump government.

Article from The Guardian

On April 5, 2017, FP2030 reproduced the publication from The Guardian titled “The Trump Administration halts money to the UN population fund over abortion rules.” The text criticized the decision of the government of Donald Trump to withdraw financing from the United Nations Population Fund — UNFPA — for “supporting or participating in the management of a coercive abortion program or involuntary sterilization,” and referred to the Mexico City Policy as the “Global Gag Rule.”

It quoted Marge Berer, international coordinator of the “International Campaign for Women’s Right to Safe Abortion,” who maintained that this cut in financing would be a liberation for the UNFPA. Berer points out that “there is no doubt that many of those who do provide



information and services for safe abortion... will suffer a grave loss of financing as a result of the vicious anti-woman stance of the Trump government.”

3.2.3. New funds destined for FP2030 to replace the USAID funding cut

As a result of the cuts imposed by Donald Trump’s government on organizations that promote or execute abortions, FP2030 lost a significant part of its international financing. Instead of adjusting its activities to exclude abortion and thus maintaining the support of the United States, the network chose to seek new contributions from international actors and philanthropists openly favorable to the pro-abortion agenda. Among these stand out Warren Buffett, the Gates Foundation, the European Union, the She Decides initiative, and the organization DKT International. Thanks to these funds, FP2030 not only managed to sustain its operations, but even expanded its global reach in the promotion and provision of abortion services.

On September 24, 2019, FP2030 disseminated on its official page an article from the Vox portal titled “How billionaire philanthropy provides reproductive health care when politicians won’t.” The text criticized cuts to U.S. foreign aid in “reproductive health” applied by Republican administrations, which it labels as “whims of the U.S. electorate.” Likewise, it highlighted that “Bill Gates and Warren Buffett, two of the biggest philanthropists in the world, are the principal providers of access to contraception globally, and that Buffett is also the principal funder of access to abortion for poor women in the United States.”

On March 17, 2025, FP2030 disseminated on its website a statement by Ms. Ulla E. Muller, executive director of EngenderHealth, in which she highlighted the backing of various international actors in the face of the reinstatement of the policy promoted by President Donald Trump. Muller indicated that the European Union committed \$50,000,000 and that the She Decides initiative allocated another \$200,000,000, resources destined to support organizations that offer counseling and information about abortion, in addition to facilitating the referral of people toward those services. Likewise, she underlined that this global effort is sustained with the constant support of the Gates Foundation.

will impact some 60 low- and middle- income countries that benefit from US global health assistance. Striking a note of optimism, she points out that though the US is a big donor for health services, it is not the biggest. A significant number of donors are from the EU. To counter the impact of the US cutbacks, health activists are already looking at alternate sources of aid. Private foundations have stepped in and large donors have pledged additional \$ 50 million globally. The Gates Foundation support too continues for attaining the Family Planning 2020 goals. She Decides, an organisation started in Holland, now supported by Sweden, Denmark, Belgium and other countries met in Brussels early this March and pledged additional \$ 200 million for contraception and safe abortion. Countries that could not provide funds, promised political support for women's health and development.

Likewise, in September 2025, in the context of the policies implemented by the Donald Trump government, DKT International announced that it would double its commitment with the FP2030 program, raising it to \$2,000,000,000 dollars toward the year 2030. The organization explained that this decision responded to the reductions in the financing of international donors for family planning, including the withdrawal of USAID, historically considered the biggest bilateral donor of global “reproductive health” programs.

4. Member organizations of Family Planning 2030: an explicitly abortionist network

In the previous chapter, it was shown that FP2030 promotes abortion as part of its concept of family planning. This chapter broadens the analysis toward the organizations that compose it. It is a network of international and local actors that drew up commitments with FP2030 in terms of “family planning services” and “sexual and reproductive rights,” but whose institutional activity is openly geared towards abortion. The members of FP2030 are not simply circumstantial allies, but true engines of the abortionist agenda, with a militant and explicit stance on the matter.

In section 4.1, the principal NGOs of international scope that have signed commitments with FP2030 will be reviewed, among them FIGO, EngenderHealth, Pathfinder, Women Deliver, Fòs Feminista, MSI Reproductive Choices, the Guttmacher Institute, and IPPF. All these organizations, from their own institutional platforms, strategic documents, and advocacy activities, actively promote abortion as a human right, drive its inclusion in universal health coverage, and foster its decriminalization at the global level.

Sections 4.2 and 4.3 will descend to the regional and national level, addressing the organizations that act as members of two other abortion networks such as IPPF and CLACAI. In countries of Ibero America such as Mexico, Colombia, Peru, Bolivia, and Chile, these entities reproduce locally the same ideological guidelines, provide abortion services, drive campaigns for the normalization of abortion, press for legal reforms, and offer digital training on how to access abortion.

This chapter confirms that the members of FP2030 not only support abortion, rather they promote it as a central priority of their institutional actions. Far from being a diverse or plural network, FP2030 constitutes an ideologically homogeneous alliance that works in a coordinated fashion to consolidate abortion as a pillar of international policy in sexual and reproductive health.





On its institutional website, Pathfinder has claimed that abortion services are vital and essential not only for women but also for girls.

OVERVIEW

When girls and women have the right to control their own bodies, sexuality, and fertility, it transforms gender relations and increases their ability to live happier, healthier, and more fulfilling lives. A world without fear, stigma, or discrimination is a prerequisite for gender equality, as is one's ability to live according to their sexual health and rights. In order to realize these rights, governments and civil society partners need to adopt comprehensive approaches to protect and uphold them while empowering individuals to claim their rights, including strong legal and policy frameworks; access to information and comprehensive sexuality education (CSE); protecting the rights of marginalized groups; ensuring accountability; and involving boys and men in national efforts to respect, protect, and fulfill sexual rights.

SECTION 1: FRAMING THE ISSUE

On its official website, Women Deliver has identified the “fight against the global anti-rights movement” as one of its lines of action, which it considers a threat for “denying and reversing the advances in sexual and reproductive health and rights, including access to abortion.”





COUNTERING THE ANTI-RIGHTS MOVEMENT GLOBALLY

For decades, a powerful and well-funded coalition of anti-rights actors has been working to undermine girls' and women's bodily autonomy and sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR). Between 2008 and 2017, "anti-gender" groups in the United States alone saw their total revenue rise to \$6.2 billion, with at least \$1 billion of this funding being used to support anti-gender movements worldwide. Their growing influence is evident in regressive policies in countries like the United States, El Salvador, Poland, and Uganda. These groups have also strategically infiltrated global forums to manipulate and weaponize human rights language and suppress pro-SRHR voices within civil society.

At the United Nations, anti-rights organizations are pushing resolutions on "protecting the family" to undermine access to SRHR. They promote a conservative interpretation of human rights, including the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, to deny and roll back hard-won gains in SRHR, such as access to safe abortion and comprehensive sexuality education.

4.1.5. Fòs Feminista



4.1.7. Alan Guttmacher Institute

The Guttmacher Institute has committed to carrying out evidence-based policy-advocacy activities in order to drive reforms that broaden access to family planning and related SRH services. Guttmacher will play a fundamental role in global monitoring of indicators, generating national-level estimates of unintended pregnancies and abortions that can indicate the needs of family planning. It also commits to playing a coordinating role to support harmonization in the use of national data on unintended pregnancies and abortions among different organizations that model the impacts of family planning.

Guttmacher Institute Commitment

Narrative:

The Guttmacher Institute pledges to help build the scientific infrastructure necessary to advance equitable, evidence-based family planning policies and programs worldwide, by carrying out timely research that is responsive to the express needs of in-country and global stakeholders. The Institute further commits to strategically disseminate evidence to key decision-makers and other stakeholders and to carry out evidence-based advocacy with the intention of bringing about reforms that expand access to family planning and related SRH services. In carrying out these activities, the Institute will collaborate with a wide range of partners—from local research institutions to UN agencies—to amplify the reach and impact of our work and support the aims of key allies across the globe. A theme cutting across Guttmacher’s contribution will be a focus on advancing equity and anti-colonialist praxis, as detailed below. Guttmacher commits to four contributions to advance the goals of the FP2030 partnership:

In its commitment with FP2030, they declared that they will promote public-policy reforms and recommendations situating family planning “within the comprehensive package of sexual and reproductive rights as defined by the Guttmacher-Lancet Commission.” That commission, published in *The Lancet* (2018), explicitly includes safe and legal abortion as an essential component of universal coverage of sexual and reproductive health.

(3) Carrying out evidence-based advocacy to build supportive policy environments

We will bring our expertise in evidence-based advocacy to bear to advance sound FP policies. We will advocate directly to key actors with the power to implement policy change or allocate resources (e.g., via regular briefings for bilateral donors). When working at the country and regional levels, we will largely play a supportive role, ensuring that our partners take the lead on policymaker engagement. Our staff will participate in relevant advocacy coalitions working to advance access to and funding for family planning, such as the International Family Planning Coalition in the U.S., as well as support advocates using evidence from *Adding It Up*, *Just the Numbers* and the Family Planning Investment Impact Calculator to make the case for increased funding for family planning. We will seek to influence relevant UN statements, processes, and agreements and craft policy analyses that explicate the implications and applications of evidence and lay out targeted policy recommendations. **Across these efforts, we will promote individual rights and needs by situating FP within the comprehensive package of SRHR as defined by the Guttmacher-Lancet Commission.**

The Guttmacher-*Lancet* Commission also recommends an essential package of sexual and reproductive health interventions that align with this comprehensive definition of SRHR. The package includes the commonly recognized components of sexual and reproductive health, including contraceptive services, maternal and newborn care, and prevention and treatment of HIV/AIDS. It also includes less commonly provided interventions that are necessary for a holistic approach to addressing SRHR: care for STIs other than HIV; comprehensive sexuality education; safe abortion care; prevention, detection and counseling for gender-based violence; prevention, detection and treatment of infertility and cervical cancer; and counseling and care for sexual health and well-being.

The Guttmacher Institute maintains that, to guarantee access to a full range of sexual and reproductive health services, it is necessary to include abortion services, and it recommends that national health systems incorporate a comprehensive package of essential services that includes contraception and safe abortion services. In addition, the institute posits that continuity in investments is required to maintain these commitments within global sexual and reproductive health and rights programs.

4.1.8. International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF)

In the text of its commitment with FP2030, IPPF reaffirmed its focus on “guaranteeing equitable access to sexual and reproductive health services, promoting equity and a special focus on youth and adolescents,” as well as the promotion of contraceptives as part of health services and “sexual and reproductive rights.” More details will be given later showing that this focus conceals the promotion of abortion.





In its document “How to include the topic of abortion in education: Essential points,” aimed at educators, IPPF proposed that youth should “critically explore their attitudes toward abortion” and receive information that “reinforces their understanding of abortion as part of sexual and reproductive health and rights.”

In another institutional publication titled “How to improve young people’s access to safe abortion – Ghana,” IPPF explicitly claimed that young people face significant barriers to accessing legal and safe abortion, such as stigma, misinformation, and biases of health personnel.

4.1.9. DKT International

In the commitment signed between DKT International and FP2030, the goal was established to finance family-planning programs and to contribute resources by means of other support mechanisms, such as social marketing. The commitment expressly states: “DKT International, one of the largest providers of sexual and reproductive health products and services in the developing world, commits to the Family Planning 2030 (FP2030) Movement. Through financial and direct services (...) the organization will also invest \$1,000,000,000 of discretionary resources, including the procurement of commodities, between 2021 and 2030.”





DKT WomanCare Global is a subsidiary of DKT International that “collaborates with manufacturers to expand access, availability, and affordability of family-planning and “safe abortion” products.” It currently markets and distributes manual vacuum aspiration (MVA) kits and medical abortion pills in 90 countries. In 2017, DKT International acquired the rights to the Ipas manual vacuum aspiration technology, a medical device with ISO 13485 certification for uterine evacuation, which is distributed in more than 100 countries.

DKT WomanCare offers two options of abortion with medications for diverse contexts and clinical situations: Miso-Fem (Misoprostol) and MisoMife-Fem Combo (Misoprostol + Mifepristone). According to the organization these two alternatives “offer a non-invasive, private, and more natural alternative to surgical abortion.”

El aborto con medicamentos es un aspecto importante del servicio de salud reproductiva que ofrece DKT WomanCare Global, que ofrece una alternativa segura y eficaz al aborto quirúrgico. En DKT WomanCare Global, ofrecemos dos opciones de aborto con medicamentos para diversos contextos y situaciones clínicas: **Miso-Fem** y **MisoMife-Fem Combo**.

Miso-Fem contiene únicamente misoprostol, un análogo de la prostaglandina. DKT has developed a chatbot called “Ally,” with the objective of providing clear and precise information on self-managed abortion with medications, specifically Mifepristone and Misoprostol. Available in 15 countries and 7 languages, it functions mainly through WhatsApp and is designed to offer guidance on dosage, administration, side effects, warning signs, and post-care.

4.2.3. Human Rights Equity and Gender Foundation – FUNDHEG

FUNDHEG has committed to training youth in Comprehensive Sexual Education – CSE and to offering 200 annual services of contraceptive methods with a gender approach in rural areas, in addition to providing 700 sexual and reproductive health consultations. The organization has assumed this role to drive access to sexual and reproductive rights among youth and vulnerable populations.

In its advocacy actions and institutional networks, FUNDHEG explicitly promotes access to legal, safe, and free abortion, denouncing the stigma and criminalization that persist even in cases of sexual violence or child pregnancy.

La Directora Ejecutiva de Fundheg, Diana Cabral y la Voluntaria Joven, Selene Guanabens, también de la misma organización, formaron parte de distintos momentos del Foro que tenía por objetivo reunir a las representantes de la Sociedad Civil, de forma presencial y virtual, para considerar la presentación final que se realizará a las Ministras y Autoridades durante las jornadas siguientes.

Cabral fue parte de la Mesa que inició el Foro con la presentación de los ejes del documento. Durante la instancia aseveró que el manifiesto hace referencia a "la deuda con la justicia sexual y reproductiva". De esta forma, indica que "si bien sabemos que tenemos avances en nuestra región, todavía el **aborto sigue siendo criminalizado**, seguimos teniendo estigmas, inclusive esto se da en contextos de violación y violencia sexual en infancia y en todo tipo de mujeres en toda sus diversidades".

"Esto también hace que nuestra región tengamos altas tasas de embarazo infantil y adolescente y junto al matrimonio infantil, son prácticas nocivas frecuentes que aún siguen siendo naturalizadas, y también se da por complicidad de los estados", aseveró la Directora Ejecutiva.

4.2.4. Cry, Courage and Effort — LLAVES

In its commitment with FP2030, LLAVES committed to strengthening Comprehensive Sexual Education in Honduras, training adolescents, teachers, and communities to reduce unplanned pregnancies, clandestine abortions, and maternal insecurity. Among its goals, it included reaching 600 adolescents, 50 journalists, and 200 women leaders during 2024, as well as developing digital campaigns with at least one million interactions and generating relevant data on the sexual and reproductive rights of youth with HIV. In addition, it promotes the reform of the Comprehensive Sexual Education Law and the Special HIV Law in the country.

4.2.5. Chilean Association for the Protection of the Family – APROFA

In its commitment with FP2030, APROFA has committed to expanding access to sexual and reproductive health services with an alleged human rights approach and a gender perspective. It proposed carrying out more than 230,000 clinical consultations, as well as to provide contraceptive methods to more than 40,000 people from now to 2030. This commitment is directed especially at women, youth, and vulnerable populations, and seeks to contribute to the reduction of unplanned pregnancies, guarantee bodily autonomy, and strengthen comprehensive sexual education in community contexts.

Para 2030, APROFA se compromete a atender a 40.000 personas y prestar 230.000 servicios que incluyen tanto consultas clínicas como sensibilización y acceso a métodos anticonceptivos.

4.3.1. Center for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Rights – PROMSEX

In the text of its commitment with FP2030, PROMSEX concentrated its attention on the prevention of unplanned pregnancies among adolescents through digital campaigns. We will see later how these “prevention” communication campaigns include abortion.

4.3.2. Oriéntame Foundation

In the text of its commitment with FP2030, Oriéntame Foundation declared that it will provide “abortion and post abortion care, including the initiation of post abortion contraceptive methods,” as part of its work in sexual and reproductive health with a gender and rights approach. It also committed to sensitize 10,000 adolescents, youth, and adult women annually, and to contribute to Sustainable Development Goal target 5.6., which seeks to “guarantee universal access to sexual and reproductive health services and reproductive rights.”

4.3.3. Manuela Ramos Movement

In its commitment with FP2030, the Manuela Ramos Movement committed to implementing Comprehensive Sexual Education in 16 schools in Lima, Ayacucho, and Ucayali, training some 1,500 adolescents per year. In addition, it will train 300 young activists to defend “sexual and reproductive rights,” and will ensure that 4,800 diverse women receive information about these rights, mobilizing themselves in community networks and promoting public policies. It also states that it will drive citizen oversight to support the “right to decide” and the decriminalization of abortion for rape.

En Perú, país en el que no contamos con políticas públicas que garanticen educación sexual integral en las escuelas, donde cada año entre 1000 y 1400 niñas menores de 15 años llegan a ser madres y aproximadamente 8000 casos de violencia sexual son atendidos en los Centros de Emergencia Mujer, de los cuales 86% se trata de víctimas entre 12 y 17 años, el Movimiento Manuela Ramos viene desarrollando un modelo de transferencia de herramientas de gestión y pedagógicas para desarrollar la Educación Sexual Integral en 16 escuelas distribuidas en tres regiones del país (Lima, Ayacucho y Ucayali). Además de fortalecer las competencias de personal de salud para ofrecer servicios diferenciados de salud sexual y reproductiva en 6 establecimientos de salud. Cada año aproximadamente 1,500 adolescentes reciben ESI, orientación y servicios en salud sexual y reproductiva y 100 adolescentes y jóvenes desarrollan competencias para liderar acciones de vigilancia ciudadana y defensa de sus derechos sexuales y reproductivos. Para el 2025, esperamos que en cada una de las regiones de intervención se cuenten con al menos dos escuelas modelo de implementación de ESI y dos establecimientos de salud en las que las y los adolescentes encuentran servicios de salud sexual reproductiva de calidad.

Por otro lado, para el 2025 son al menos 4,800 mujeres diversas (adolescentes, jóvenes, indígenas, lesbianas, migrantes, etc.) en tres regiones del país que han sido informadas sobre sus derechos sexuales y reproductivos y su derecho a una vida libre de violencias y que participant desde sus organizaciones comunitarias, colectivas feministas, de acciones de vigilancia y demanda de servicios de salud sexual y reproductiva y políticas de igualdad de género.

Para el 2025, Manuela Ramos habrá formado al menos a 300 mujeres jóvenes como activistas en su Programa de voluntariado feminista, que en articulación con lideresas de otras organizaciones feministas y de defensa de derechos humanos a nivel nacional contribuyen a la defensa de los derechos sexuales y reproductivos en activa vigilancia de las políticas públicas y a través de acciones ciudadanas para avanzar en el **derecho a decidir y la despenalización del aborto** por violación sexual en el país.

Manuela Ramos also commemorates every September 28 as the “Global Day of Action for Legal and Safe Abortion”, demanding full decriminalization and stating that this is key to reducing deaths from unsafe abortions. This stance goes beyond the grounds of rape and fits within an international feminist agenda for the “right to decide” without legal restrictions.

4.3.4. CIES Sexual and Reproductive Health Bolivia

CIES Bolivia committed to providing 200,000 family-planning services to adult women, youth, and adolescents between 2021 and 2025. In addition, it planned to reach 30,000 additional minors with information on contraceptive methods, in order to strengthen the right to decide in vulnerable populations. We will see later that this included the promotion of abortion.





Within the framework of the CIES Bolivia program in 2020, the organization developed educational workshops aimed at youth in which “sexual and reproductive rights” were addressed from a comprehensive perspective. Among the topics covered, abortion within the Bolivian legal margins was included, emphasizing not only access to contraceptive methods and the right to decide, but also the need to socially decriminalize this practice, promoting its acceptance as part of youth sexual health.

CIES Bolivia was part of the report “To be able to choose without risk,” prepared by CLACAI, where action was sought to promote the decriminalization of abortion in the country. Together with other organizations they participated in strategies that sought not only to facilitate abortion on legal grounds, but to open the way to broader recognition of abortion as a right.

4.3.5. ASISTE – Colombia

One of the FP2030 members in Colombia is the ASISTE committee, an initiative that provides accompaniment and support to young women and adolescents accessing abortion, also promoting the elimination of stigma around the “voluntary interruption of pregnancy,” particularly in the Tumaco region.

ASISTE has declared its belonging to collectives linked to the Just Cause Movement (Movimiento Causa Justa), a national initiative that promotes the total decriminalization of abortion in Colombia by eliminating this crime from the Penal Code.

Among its principal actions is the campaign “Let’s talk about abortion,” focused on the normalization of this practice, as well as active accompaniment with pregnant youth who express their decision to abort.

Narrative:

The mission of the ASISTE Oversight Committee (Apoyo Solidario e Integral para el Aborto Seguro en Tumaco - Solidarity and Comprehensive Support for Safe Abortion in Tumaco) is to supervise and evaluate access to voluntary termination of pregnancy (VTP) services in the municipality of Tumaco, Nariño, in full compliance with reproductive rights and current rulings.

The creation and operation of this oversight committee is supported by Resolution 133, issued on August 26 of 2024 by the District Ombudsman of Tumaco, which grants it full legitimacy in its supervision and monitoring activities. The team that makes up this oversight committee is made up of four young women, between the ages of 22 and 25, all of them Afro-descendants and professionals in the fields of Education and Social and Community Work. Their multidisciplinary approach covers diverse perspectives, such as gender, social intervention, youth, among others, which allows them to comprehensively and effectively address the challenges related to reproductive rights in Tumaco.

ASISTE has supported other strategies such as:

- "Breaking the silence", of the municipal administration in Tumaco during the year 2023
- "let's talk about abortion" which aims to break stereotypes and biases that revolve around VTP, in 2024.
- Other initiatives and training strategies on topics of Peace and school mediation, especially in promoting the denormalization of gender violence, in coordination with the House of Memory in Tumaco.

We also belong to the collectives that work in coordination with the Causa Justa Movement, a pioneering movement in the country that seeks the freedom and reproductive autonomy of all women over their bodies and their life projects. Causa Justa was created in 2017, as an initiative of the Mesa por la Vida y la Salud de las Mujeres and has led public debate on abortion in Colombia to advance the elimination of the crime of abortion from the Penal Code.

5. Conclusions

The evidence presented in this report allows the fact that FP2030 is **an international platform that includes and promotes abortion as the structural axis of its global strategy** to be established categorically

The evidence shows us five aspects of FP2030's promotion of abortion:

1. **Abortion as a “human right”**: Through its publications and statements, FP2030 and its allies equate abortion with contraceptive methods, placing it at the same level of priority within sexual and reproductive health services. This approach redefines the very concept of family planning.

2. **Institutional financing oriented to promoting abortion**: FP2030 has received direct financing from donors such as USAID, whose funds end up backing regional structures, operating programs, and campaigns that promote abortion. This relationship shows that international financing plays a central role in the consolidation of this agenda.

3. **Political activism and ideological reaction**: The network has demonstrated an explicit reaction to policies that restrict abortion financing, such as the Mexico City Policy. Instead of excluding abortion as a method of family planning, FP2030 adopts a confrontational and militant stance, aligning itself with sectors that advocate for the unrestricted legalization of abortion.

4. **International alliances openly pro-abortion**: FP2030 relies on organizations that do not hide their commitment to the expansion of abortion: IPPF, MSI, Pathfinder, FIGO, the Alan Guttmacher Institute, among others. These entities develop projects that actively promote decriminalization of abortion, self-managed abortion, sexual education with a pro-abortion focus, and political pressure on governments.

5. **Local penetration through openly pro-abortion national NGOs**: In Ibero-America and the Caribbean, organizations such as Profamilia (Colombia), APROFA (Chile), MEXFAM (Mexico), PROMSEX and Manuela Ramos (Peru), among others, utilize the global FP2030 approach at the national level. Their activities include not only the provision of abortion services, but also digital training, judicial activism, public campaigns, and alliances with the State. Ultimately, FP2030 has consolidated itself as a global ideological platform that articulates financing, political activism, and media coverage to transform abortion into universal public policy, using a language of rights and health that conceals an agenda of decriminalization, legalization, and institutionalization of abortion worldwide
